Brief History

Most land in PNG belongs to the people of Papua New Guinea and not the state. Land needed by the state must be acquired under the provisions of the Land Act from customary owners. Of the total area of PNG, approximately 800,000 hectares has been alienated. This consists of about 600,000 hectares of State owned land and 200,000 hectares of freehold land. The granting of freehold land ceased in 1914 and most alienated land is held on Government Leases.

Registration of land in PNG has been mainly confined to alienated land and is based on the Torrens System.

Land registration whether it be alienated land or customary land is administered by the Department of Lands and Physical Planning. The Department has over fifty (50) processes and administers 12 legislations to cater for land administration services.
